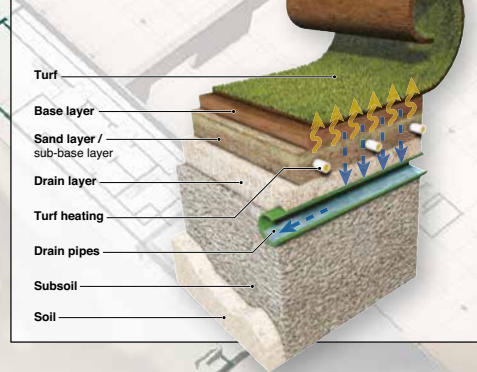
SEATING PLAN

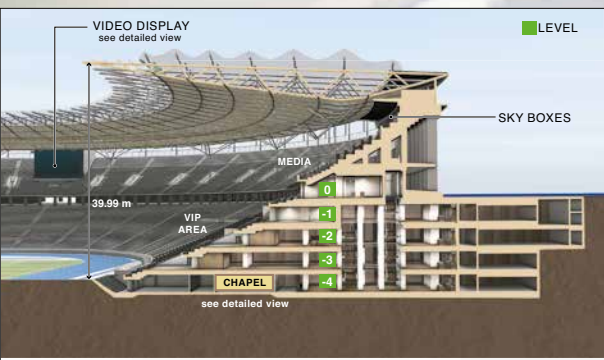
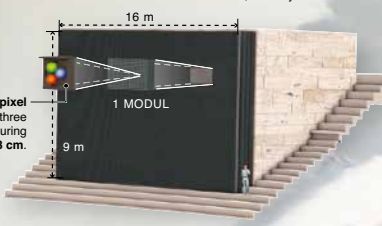


BASEMENT

In the south-west the stadium is underlaid by two- to four-storied floors, so the team coaches and VIP-cars can literally enter the stadium. The access routes are also used by rescue teams in case of emergencies. In the north-east an additional underground car park provides further parking space for **157 vehicles.**

VIDEO DISPLAY

The video screen in the east stand with its **140 m² display** is the largest of its kind which can be found in an European stadium. It consists of numerous components of pixels. The resolution is **688 by 384 pixels**. A second, smaller video screen is located above the reverse stand, 10 m by 6 m in size.



VIP AREA

In the southern part of the Olympic Stadium there is an atrium since 2004, which extends over four levels. Together with the adjacent rooms and lounges it provides space for **1,700 people.**
